
1. Nathan Azhderian


Nathan Azhderian, b. 1982, BFA Cooper, MFA Yale Painting, lives/works NYC







Anderson also has 2d works which will be on display. Images forthcoming.



4. Fawn Krieger

Fawn Krieger, b. 1975, BFA Parsons, MFA Bard, lives/works NYC

Fawn Krieger is a NY-based artist, born in 1975, who is invested in the politics of touch, embodiment, ownership, and becoming. Krieger's Flintstonian tactility, leanings toward industrial materials, and penchant for scale compressions, unfold an unlikely collision of private and public, where intimate moments also serve as social ruptures. She received her BFA from Parsons School of Design, and her MFA from Bard College's Milton Avery Graduate School of the Arts. Her work has been exhibited at The Kitchen (NY), Art in General (NY), Nice & Fit Gallery (Berlin), The Moore Space (Miami), Von Lintel Gallery (NY), the Rose Art Museum at Brandeis University (Boston), Portland Institute for Contemporary Art (OR), Soloway Gallery (NY), and Neon>fdv (Milan). Krieger is the recipient of grants from Art Matters Foundation (2008) and the Jerome Foundation (2007), and currently teaches at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

In her words:

FAULTS are film recorded exchanges of material impacts and fissures. Fractures, dispersion, saturation, and fusion are revealed through intimate, tactile encounters and gestures. The small events are filmed up close so the materials become landscape, traversing a geography of touch, building, and destruction, and proposing that faults are foundations to build from and on.

FAULTS were filmed in 2011 on Super 8 Kodak silent color negative film, with a Canon Auto Zoom 518 SV, produced between 1970-1975.


Bader will exhibit a new work which will make manifest an encounter between 4 historical figures. The medium is human dandruff, dims and title TBA.
